

Things to Do in Arundel and Nearby Areas

ARUNDEL

Arundel Castle Explore nearly 1,000 years of history at this stunning medieval castle. Open daily from 10am to 5pm. Guided tours available.

Arundel Cathedral Beautiful 19th-century Gothic-style cathedral with breathtaking architecture. Open for visitors and services throughout the week.

Swanbourne Lake Scenic walking trails and boat hire available. Perfect for a relaxing stroll or a family picnic, or try Swanbourne tea rooms for afternoon tea, light bites and refreshments.

Arundel Museum Learn about the history of Arundel and its local heritage. Family-friendly with interactive exhibits.

The Black Rabbit Pub Riverside pub with great views and traditional British food. Ideal for a relaxed lunch or evening drink.

Arundel Wetland Centre Home to a variety of wildlife including rare birds and otters. Open daily for walking and wildlife spotting.

Independent Shops & Cafés Discover unique gifts, antiques, and handmade crafts in Arundel's charming high street.

The Lido An open air outdoor swimming pool with small refreshment area. Grass area for picnics, and car parking.

Things to Do in Nearby Locations

LITTLEHAMPTON (10-minute drive from Arundel)

Littlehampton Beach Sandy beach is perfect for a family day out, with amusements, cafes, and scenic walks.

Harbour Park Family-friendly amusement park with rides, mini-golf, and arcades.

Littlehampton Marina Ideal for a relaxing walk along the river or renting a boat.

The Look and Sea Centre Interactive museum focusing on the coastal environment, with panoramic views from the top.

The Wave Leisure Centre Swimming pool facilities, with cafe area and parking.

BOGNOR REGIS (20-minute drive from Arundel)

Bognor Regis Beach A traditional seaside resort with beautiful sandy beaches and a lively promenade.

Hotham Park A large park with boating lakes, a miniature railway, and a cafe.

Bognor Regis Museum Small but charming museum exploring the history of Bognor Regis and its development as a seaside town.

Butlins Bognor Regis Resort A famous holiday park with entertainment, swimming, and family activities.

BRIGHTON (45-minute drive from Arundel)

Brighton Pier Classic British amusement pier with arcades, fairground rides, and food stalls.

Royal Pavilion A historic royal residence with stunning Indo-Saracenic architecture and beautiful gardens.

The Lanes A maze of narrow alleyways filled with quirky shops, cafes, and antique stores.

Brighton Beach & Promenade A vibrant pebble beach with cafes, street performers, and beautiful sea views.

British Airways i360 A 162-meter tall observation tower offering incredible views over the city and coastline.

Sea Life Centre The oldest operating aquarium in the world. SEA LIFE Brighton features 5,500 mesmerising creatures including Rays, Sharks, Turtles, Terrapins,

Star Fish, Seahorses and an Anaconda.

PORTSMOUTH (40-minute drive from Arundel)

Portsmouth Historic Dockyard Visit historic ships like HMS Victory and HMS Warrior, plus the National Museum of the Royal Navy.

Spinnaker Tower Iconic 170-meter observation tower with 360-degree views of Portsmouth and the surrounding areas.

Southsea Common Large open park with views of the Solent, perfect for picnics, walking, and relaxing by the sea.

Portsmouth Museum and Art Gallery A mix of historical and contemporary exhibitions, including displays on the city's maritime history.

LONDON (90-minute train ride from Arundel)

The British Museum Home to one of the world's largest and most comprehensive collections of art and history.

The Tower of London Iconic fortress with a rich history, home to the Crown Jewels and ancient stories of kings and queens.

Buckingham Palace The official residence of the British monarch, with Changing of the Guard ceremonies.

The Houses of Parliament and Big Ben Visit the seat of British government, featuring stunning architecture and a famous clock tower.

Covent Garden A lively area with street performers, boutique shops, and fantastic dining options.

The London Eye A giant observation wheel offering spectacular views of London's landmarks and the River Thames.

Hyde Park One of London's largest and most famous parks, ideal for walking, picnicking, and boating on the Serpentine.
